The *Associate in Science in Business Administration (BAVM)* degree is a collegiate degree program consisting of lower-division courses designed to prepare students to enter the business world as mid-managers in a variety of environments, or to enter the state university system in the School of Business. Students who choose the latter route should be aware that she/he will be required to take at least an additional 15 credits of general education courses upon transfer to the state university of her/his choice.

This is the sequence of courses for students interesting in majoring in *Business Administration* and transferring to the FGC *Bachelor of Science in Business Administration* degree program<sup>ii</sup>. It does not represent a contract, nor does it guarantee course availability. Following this pathway will help you earn a *BAVM* degree<sup>iii</sup>.
