The Operations Management Technology program is a limited access program, designed to provide graduates of certificate programs access to the technical, supervisory and management skills necessary to further career opportunities. - 5) Recognize appropriate administrative policies, objectives, and procedures to institute organizational control and assess management effectiveness and quality.
