The Associate in Science Degree in Nursing (ASDN) Traditional Generic program is designed to provide the students with the basic knowledge and skills to successfully assess, plan and implement care for patients. Graduates of this program enter a challenging and exciting field with a variety of employment opportunities such as: acute, emergency, critical, home health, maternal and infant care. The ASDN Traditional Generic program, is a competitive, limited access program, that begins each fall and spring qualifies the student to take the national licensing exam to become a registered nurse.

Please see the ASDN Traditional Generic application packet on the FGC website that will provide additional information regarding the admission requirements of the program, including a required separate supplemental application. Clinicals are required for this program. Clinicals may not follow regular college schedule, and can include weekdays, evenings or weekends. Students will be required to submit current physical and immunizations. Drug and background screen must be completed and student must be cleared prior to attending clinicals.
