I. Call to Order

The regular meeting of the District Board of Trustees was called to order January 9, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. by Chairperson Lindsey Lander.

Board member Mr. Chuck Brannan was tardy, he arrived after the Consent Agenda and did not participate in the former votes. Board Member Dr. Miguel Tepedino participated via telephone following the presentation of the Consent Agenda.

All votes were unanimous unless stated otherwise.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Lindsey Lander led the board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. Audience of Any Citizen

There was no response.

IV. Approval of Minutes

Ms. Renae Allen made a motion to approve the November 14, 2024 Board meeting minutes. Dr. James Surrency seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

V. Student Government Report

Ms. Zamaria Granado, SGA President was absent and no information was given.

VI. Presentation of Consent Agenda

Mr. John Medina made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of items “A” through “D”. Ms. Suzanne Norris seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

VII. Academic Affairs

Dr. Kathleen Ciez-Volz, Vice President of Academic Affairs started her report by welcoming back faculty for the Spring 2025 semester, and announcing the launch of the FGC Academic Affairs monthly bulletin.

Dr. Ciez-Volz continued her report by saying the college will be hosting a Brain Bowl tournament on Saturday, January 11th. Additionally, work on the new HVAC facility, which is being financed by the Florida Capitalization Incentive grant, began in December. The Welding Program had a 100% pass rate on the American Welding Society certification exam.

Vice President Ciez-Volz gave updates in several of her areas. The Teacher Preparation Programs had approximately 330 students enroll. The Nursing Department held a new student orientation with 133 ASDN and PN students. The Library and the Institutional Effectiveness Team are working on a strategic plan for the SACSCOC fifth year interim report that is due this September.

Lastly, Orlando Macias Sanchez and the eLearning team are working together to support the creation and delivery of student-centered courses. A two-part student panel series will also be held by the instructional council with the aim of gathering student opinions regarding the application of AI in higher education.

VIII. Student Affairs and Public Information

Mr. Anthony Cardenas, Vice President of Student Affairs and Public Information gave an update on the Athletic Teams' academic success.

Vice President Cardenas gave updates in his area. The TRIO program had their annual performance review, earning a perfect score. The TRIO and success staff also hosted a Maps and Munchies event welcoming students to campus and providing support.

IX. Enrollment and Marketing

Ms. Kacey Mimbs, Dean of Enrollment and Marketing gave updates in her area. In comparison to last Spring, enrollment has increased from 2,585 to 2,839 (9.8%), and credit hours have increased from 23,422 to 26,898 (14.8%). Add/Drop will continue until Tuesday, January 14. 100 students completed a newly offered class that was available from December 11th to January 7th.

There has been a collaboration with Enrollment Services, Financial Aid, Institutional Research, Business Services, and Technology on complying with gainful employment regulations.

Ms. Mimbs invited Board members to the New York, New York Dueling Pianos show taking place in the Howard Conference Center on February 14th, starting at 7:30 PM.

A video wall for the PAC's stage will be installed by audiovisual later in February. They've also updated the Esports broadcasting equipment for live streaming, as well as transitioning the college channel to a digital broadcast.

XI.

President's Report

Dr. Barrett began his report requesting to move the next two Board meetings from Baker and Dixie counties to Lake City, there were no objections. He noted, the college recently hosted the Columbia County Delegation Meeting and the annual Suwannee River Water Management Conference on campus. Also, the ground breaking for the STEM II Building will be held on January 29th at 10:00 AM.

Construction has started for the HVAC facility, and the expansion and renovation for the Welding Lab. Also, the Green House renovations will be completed in the coming weeks. We have a prototype for the new student housing Tiny Home that will be ready and arriving to campus in February.

Dr. Barrett gave an update on the action against the City of Lake City. He then asked Ms. Meagan Logan, Board Attorney to update Board members. Ms. Logan sent a letter to the attorney for the City of Lake City outlining our issues and requesting a reply with an action plan on November 25th. Trustee Norris inquired about the cost to fix the damage the dam has created and requested FGC to contact Suwannee River Water Management to work on resolving this issue.

Lastly, there was a brief discussion on the Lakeshore Hospital Authority possibly donating a building to the college. This potential new donation would help the college expand medical programs.
