

What is the Post-secondary Education Readiness Test (PERT)?

The PERT test was designed as an entry-level placement test for all first-time-in-college applicants who are applying for admission to colleges and universities in the Florida College System (FCS) and are entering a degree program (associate or bachelor's). The test measures a student's proficiency in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics. However, those students who meet the exemption criteria, as set forth in State Board Rule 6A-10.0315 are not required to provide test scores. Advisors are prepared to discuss the appropriate placement options for students who are exempt from testing or for students who do not meet the cut scores for placement into college level courses,

What is on the PERT test?

The PERT test assesses your content knowledge in reading, English language and mathematics.

How long is the test?

The test is untimed but students taking the test should plan on an estimated 1 hour per subject area or 3 hours for the entire test.

How much does the test cost?

For FGC students and in-district high school students planning to dual enroll, there is no test administration fee. For non-FGC students, the test administration fee is \$28. This fee is non-refundable.

What do I need to bring?

To sit for your exam you must bring a government-issued photo ID and your registration form. No electronic devices will be allowed in the testing area. All personal items will be put in a secure area prior to entering the testing area.
