- 2. Use innovation, technology, and best practices in instruction to provide rigorous and engaging learning experiences.
- 3. Expand transfer pathways by increasing program articulation agreements with higher education institutions.
- 4. Establish a comprehensive Career Center that helps students align educational and career goals and promotes job exploration and planning to prepare them for success in their chosen career.

The regular meeting of the District Board of Trustees was called to order May 13, 2021 at 5:05 p.m. by Chairman Mr. Miguel Tepedino

II. Pledge of Allegiance

Dr. Tepedino led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. Audience of Any Citizen

Dr. Barrett congratulated Sierra McHenry on her recognition as student of the month.

Dr. Barrett presented John Hawes a medal for being the Phi Beta Kappa Advisor for the past ten years at FGC.

IV. Approval of Board Minutes

Ms. Norris made a motion to approve the April 15, 2021 Board Meeting Minutes as presented. Ms. Allen seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

V. Student Government Report

Angelica Cray, President of Student Government, reported SGA has finalized their budget for next year and forwarded it to President for approval. They are in the process of choosing updated seating for the Student Center. Ms. Cray thanked the college on behalf of FGC students for holding in-person graduations during the past two years.

Academic Affairs

A. General Information

Vice President Brian Dopson reported rehearsals have begun for the upcoming summer performance, We Will Rock You. There are 50 people total including students and local community members working on the performance. This will be presented June 24th – June 27th.

Thanked all the staff and faculty for their help with all of the Spring Graduation Ceremonies. Dr. Dopson thanked Ms. McInnis for attending and stated he has received appreciative feedback from parents.

VIII. Enrollment Management and Student Affairs

A. General Information

Vice President Tony Cardenas reported Summer Enrollment began on April 5th, and as of today we have 1,672 students registered for 11,468 credit hours. FGC has given away 712 Microsoft Surface laptops to students as part of a laptop incentive program, for students who enrolled in a minimum of 6 credits in Summer 2021 as a standard, college level student, including an online course or course with an online component. We want to ensure our students have reliable access to online learning as we continue to navigate the pandemic.

Financial Aid Director Travis George and his team surprised all of the student recipients of the Board of Trustees Scholarship at their respective high schools. Representatives from FGC have attended and will continue to attend the award programs for each high school within the district.

FGC Summer Camps are open for registration for children ages 8 to 14 beginning in June with a \$75 fee per camp.

Dr. Barrett thanked faculty and staff for their work on the multiple graduations. He thanked Ms. McInnis for attending and Dr. Tepedino for his speech. He is contemplating doing four Fall and four Spring graduations next year to have smaller groups, more personal graduations.

Dr. Barrett thanked Travis George, Financial Aid Director, for all of his hard work with the diversity initiatives and they had a great meeting with Partnership for Strong Families yesterday.

Dr. Barrett stated the CDC has released new guidelines for those vaccinated. Starting tomorrow we will no longer require mandatory masks on campus, but will continue to social distance throughout Summer as 72% of faculty and staff have been vaccinated.

Thanks to Representative Brannon and Senator Jennifer Bradley's office the college received \$651,000.00 for the Olustee Campus and additional money for STEM Building.

Dr. Barrett asked the Board for approval to present a posthumous degree to the family of Lora Grace Duncan.

Ms. McInnis made a motion to approve the posthumous degree for Lora Grace Duncan. Ms. Norris seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously on a voice vote.

The educational plant survey is a systematic study of present educational and ancillary plants and the determination of future needs. The survey is not directly concerned with the instructional program but the relationship of educational plants to the instructional program is such that judgments regarding the instructional program are necessarily a part of an educational plant survey.

The construction, remodeling, and renovation of educational facilities is a major undertaking. The educational plant survey aids in formulating plans for housing the educational activities of students and staff of the community college for the next several years and the survey considers the local comprehensive plan in its forecast strategies. This plan represents a careful study of all available data regarding the status of educational and ancillary facilities in relation to capital outlay full-time equivalency (COFTE) student membership and the projected changes in COFTE student membership. The intent of this educational plant survey is to ensure the thoughtful, orderly development of a program for providing educational and ancillary plants to house the educational and academic support activities of the college.

The recommendations in this educational plant survey furnish the foundation for a five-year plan for educational plants adopted by the Board of Trustees in accordance with §1013.31, Florida Statutes. Similarly, the recommendations serve as the basis for the proposed building program with projects listed in the order of priority submitted pursuant to State Requirements for Educational Facilities §2.1(5).

Educational plant survey cost estimates are determined based on cost factors that are 31 months (January, the midway point of the five-year survey period) from the official beginning of the survey period, which is July 1 of the first full year of the survey. The cost per square foot for new construction, remodeling, and renovation is based on actual statewide average construction cost data with a cost index increase applied to use the mid-point of the survey costs for planning purposes. The cost estimate process applies uniformly to all surveys in all colleges so that consistent planning can be made on a statewide basis.

Cost estimates for educational plant survey recommendations provide a general idea of anticipated costs and should not be interpreted as accurate estimates for particular projects. When educational plant survey recommendations become specific projects, professionals who can estimate the actual project costs based on current construction information must prepare the estimates.

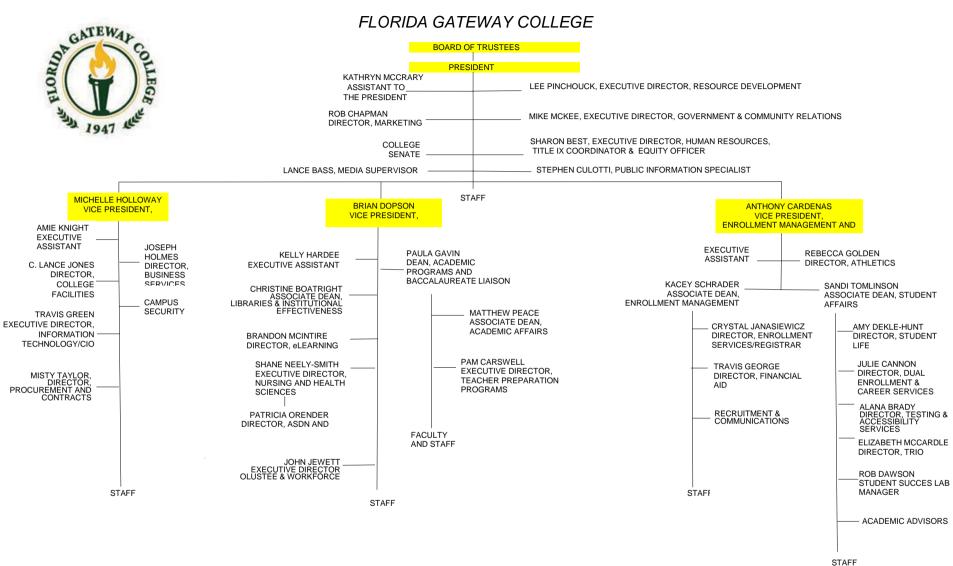
