The Phlebotomy certificate prepares a student for employment as a phlebotomist. A phlebotomist obtains blood by venipuncture or skin puncture and is an integral part of a clinical laboratory. FGC provides a low student- to - faculty ratio and hands on- learning. FGC requires 100 successful venipunctures so the student will be confident upon graduation from certificate program. After successful completion of the Phlebotomy Certificate program, students are eligible to register for and take the national certification through National Healthcareer Association (NHA).

Please see the Phlebotomy application packet on the FGC website that will provide additional information regarding the admission requirements of the occupational program, including a required separate supplemental application form. Clinicals are required for this occupational certificate. Clinicals may not follow regular college schedule, and can include weekdays, evenings or weekends. Students will be required to submit current physical and immunizations. Drug and background screen must be completed and student must be cleared prior to attending clinicals.
